Let's Go Shopping!



By participating in Play K at the library with the Let's Go Shopping playscape, your child had experiences with vocabulary and concepts centered on the theme of shopping and beginning economics. The best way to help your child learn new vocabulary and concepts is through repeated practice over time. Here are five ideas for practicing your child's new learning at home. Enjoy!

- 1. Use the new words your child learned from this playscape in everyday conversation, as often as possible. For example, "We're going to the <u>grocery store</u> today! Do you remember the name of the grocery store we go to in our <u>community</u>? Let's make a list of the food we will <u>buy</u> there to help us make <u>good choices</u>." The more times your child hears and uses new vocabulary and concepts, the easier they are to learn!
- 2. Make a list of the food you will buy at the grocery. Ask your child to draw pictures for each item. Post the list where family members can see it and comment on the different <u>purchases</u> (another new vocabulary word)! You could even make it an ongoing list with family members adding their favorite foods or special requests.
- 3. Sing this song from Storytime together:
